LIABILITY INSURANCE - TEACHERS

The Council's Insurers have agreed that any public liability claim arising from the administration of drugs (including by injection) will be dealt with by the Council's liability policy provided that: -

A General Practitioner or other suitably qualified person gives staff training in the administration of the drugs and; the drugs administered do not fall within a category which under legislation requires such treatment only to be administered by a qualified practitioner.

STAFF INDEMNITY

The Local Authority fully indemnifies its staff against claims for alleged negligence, providing they are acting within the scope of their employment, have been provided with adequate training, and are following the LA's guidelines. For the purposes of this indemnity,

- the administration of medicines (as detailed previously)
- the provision of a school meal on request

fall within this criteria and staff can be assured about the protection their employer provides. This indemnity covers the consequences that might arise where an incorrect dose is inadvertently given or where the administration is overlooked, or where a supplier warranty has been given about food products and/or ingredients. In practice the employee will not be held responsible for the costs of damages should a claim for alleged negligence be successful.
