Welcome to Reception

During the first couple of weeks we ensure that your child feels safe, happy and comfortable to come to school. We understand that this is a significant stage of your child's learning journey and see the importance of ensuring that they are confident within the setting and that they start to form relationships with our school staff and their peers.

Forest School

We are extremely lucky to have extensive and well resourced grounds at Oak Meadow. During your child's time in Reception, we utilise the environment by providing weekly forest school sessions. These will start week commencing 21st September and will be led by Mr Godwin. Your child will have the opportunity to explore a variety of natural materials, animal habitats and engage in activities linked to their prior learning.

Forest school enables your child to take appropriate risk to build their confidence, think critically to assess risk independently and further develop their gross motor skills. Your child will participate in a variety of activities such as tree climbing and den building and will learn the importance of looking after themselves, their friends and the environment.

Waterproof clothing and wellingtons are provided for your child to wear.

Reception Autumn Term

Phonics and Literacy

Within the Autumn term, we focus on the Read Write Inc Set I sounds and encourage your child to write whether that includes forming letters or mark making. The Set I sounds are taught in the following order:

m, a, s, d, t, i, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e, l, h, sh, r, j, v, y, w, th, z ch, qu, x, ng, nk In addition, your child will take part in fun and engaging activities to help build their fine motor skills which helps to develop the hand muscles used to hold a pencil correctly. For example, squeezing pegs, using tweezers and threading objects.

Reading

Each week, we will have a focus book which will be chosen due to the children's interest or linked to a particular topic or event.

Within the first couple of weeks, reading books will be given out for you to read and discuss with your child.

Maths

In Reception, our aim is to ensure that your child has a holistic understanding of number and the different counting principles. Within the Autumn term, our maths focus will consist of the following strands:

- An in depth understanding of numbers I to
 5. During this time, your child will see,
 represent, use and understand the concept of
 each individual number.
- Sorting items into groups. This allows your child to see similarities and differences with objects and numbers
- Comparing groups within 5. This enables
 your child to learn to subitise (see the total
 of objects without counting) rapidly, which
 will deepen their understanding and highlight
 the connections between numbers
- One more and one less. Within this strand, your child will be more fluent in the sequence of numbers and have an understanding of number in a different context.
- Time. This allows your child to have a good understanding of their day and use mathematical language such as 'before' and 'after'.

Home Learning

Homework is linked to our book of the week and phonic focus sounds. It is usually set on a Friday, to be returned by the following Wednesday please.

Additional Ideas for Home

Here are some ideas that you can do at home to help further your child's learning.

- Play games encouraging turn taking
- Share stories and discuss their favourite part or character
- Take part in listening games, such as eye spy
- Introduce fine motor activities that involve playdough, pegs, threading painting, tweezers, cutting and pincer movements
- Encouraging independence when getting dressed

Social Moral Spiritual Cultural

We will be working towards the completion of our Reception Cultural Capital Journey. We have collated fifty activities and events that we will be completing throughout the year.

P.E

P.E lessons will take place on a Tuesday for RT and Wednesday for RB. Please ensure that all items are clearly named. Thank you.

We will be starting the year by practising getting changed into P.E kits. Therefore we ask that you encourage your child to get dressed independently.

P.E lessons will consist of various games and activities that focus on spatial awareness, gross motor skills and balancing.
